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#### Queries for Planning a Lesson

#### Queries for planning lessons

Lessons evolve out of a perceived need or spiritual leading. It is important to be authentic in your teaching ministry. Use these questions as a guide.

What are the children's and your interests or concerns?

What is the main concern of your meeting?

What are the concerns of the parents in your First Day School?

What are the concerns of your geographical community?

What topics scare you?

Because?

What topics are you uncomfortable teaching? (Bible, Easter, etc.) If you can't teach a topic authentically, find a guest teacher who can.

- Wondering Questions are a way for children to
  - re-visit a story and
  - learn about themselves and others.
- Wondering questions do not
  - ask for facts about the story
  - have answers that are right or wrong
- Wondering questions do
  - ask about feelings and imaginings from our hearts
  - have meaning to the child and to the story

**Opening:** Our story is about children who are good friends, and how they speak the truth and seek to right a wrong.

I wonder what you would do if someone accused you of something you didn't do?
